PROFESSOR SIMONA SACCO

Simona Sacco is professor of Neurology at the University of L'Aquila in Italy and Director of the local Clinical Neurology and Stroke Unit. Dr. Sacco is author of more than 400 publications in the field of stroke and headache. She is the president of the European Stroke Organisation (ESO). She has extensive editorial activity and has the role of Editor-in-Chief of Cephalalgia and Cephalalgia Reports since 2024. She has chaired several migraine guidelines and consensus documents on behalf of the International Headache Society and the European Headache Federations.







DR USMAN ASHRAF

Dr Usman Ashraf is an Australian neurologist with subspecialty fellowships in headache. He currently works as a Clinical Research Fellow with the Headache Group of Professor Peter Goadsby at King's College London. He is passionate about improving awareness about headache amongst clinicians and the general public, providing compassionate care for his patients, as well as translational and clinical research into the biology of headache disorders and how treatments work.



PROFESSOR TONY ATTWOOD

Tony is a clinical psychologist who has specialised in Autism Spectrum Disorders since he qualified as a clinical psychologist in England in 1975. He has his own private practice, is a director of Attwood & Garnet Events, and is also adjunct professor at Griffith University, Queensland. His book Asperger's Syndrome – A Guide for Parents and Professionals has sold over 750,000 copies and has been translated into 27 languages. His subsequent book, The Complete Guide to Asperger's Syndrome, published in October 2006 has sold over 400,000 copies and has been translated into 19 languages, and is one of the primary textbooks on Asperger's syndrome, otherwise known as Autism Spectrum Disorder – Level 1. He has several subsequent books published by Jessica Kingsley Publishers, Future Horizons Inc. and Guilford Press on anxiety and depression, relationships and sexuality, employment and general advice for autistic children and adults.

He has worked with many thousands of autistic individuals of all ages with many expressions of autism.

DR CALVIN CHAN

Calvin Chan is a neurologist and the Clinical Lead at Palmerston North Hospital, New Zealand. He completed his fellowship in Headache with the Headache Group at King's College London and continues to contribute as an affiliate. Academically, he is an Honorary Clinical Lecturer for the School of Medicine, Wellington, University of Otago and contributes to the GPEP1 neurology teaching for the Royal New Zealand College of General Practitioners. He has served and continues as a council member of the ANZHS.



DR JOHN EDEN

Dr John Eden (MB BS MD RCOG RANZCOG CREI) is a reproductive endocrinologist and gynaecologist. He is a Conjoint Professor in the Department of Women and Children's Health, Royal Hospital for Women (UNSW). He is a VMO at the Royal Hospital for Women, Sydney, where he is Head of the Menopause Unit. He is a member of the Breast Cancer MDT at Prince of Wales Hospital Randwick. John is on the executive committee and co-chair of the NSW Health (ACI) Menopause Hub project. His research and clinical interests include managing menopause after breast cancer, early menopause, hormones and mood disorders, PMDD and hormonal migraine.

PROFESSOR LYN GRIFFITHS

Prof Lyn Griffiths is a Distinguished Professor in molecular genetics with more than 30 years' research experience in this field. She is also Director of the Centre for Genomics and Personalised Health which is focused on discovering better methods of diagnosing disease, developing targeted treatments based on genetic information, and training the next generation of genomics scientists. In addition, she is a passionate advocate of the translation of medical research through commercialisation and is currently the Director of the MTP Connect and industry-led Bridge and BridgeTech programs, undertaking commercialisation training for the pharmaceutical and medical devices-technology fields across Australia, respectively. Her own genetics research at the Genomics Research Centre has led to diagnostic breakthroughs for several neurogenetic disorders, including familial migraine, ataxia, epilepsy and hereditary stroke. Her research has appeared in more than 470 peer reviewed international journals, and she has been awarded significant competitive and industry research funds to support her molecular and population genetics research.



PROFESSOR JENNY GUNTON

Professor Jenny Gunton completed her medical degree at University of Queensland followed by Endocrinology and Diabetes Specialist training and then a PhD in Molecular Biology with University of Sydney. Her post-doctoral studies were in the laboratory of Prof C Ron Kahn at Joslin Diabetes Centre and Harvard Medical School.

Professor Gunton is currently the President-Elect for the Endocrine Society of Australia. She is the Director of the Centre for Diabetes and Obesity Research at the Westmead Institute for Medical Research and Chair of Medicine at Westmead Hospital, The University of Sydney. Prof Gunton's clinical interests include diabetes, obesity, and brittle bone disease.

PROFESSOR DEBBIE HAY

Debbie (BSc(Hons) [Sheffield], PhD [Imperial College London] is a Fellow of the British Pharmacological Society (FBPhS) and a Fellow of the Royal Society Te Apārangi (FRSNZ). Research in her laboratory focuses on CGRP and related receptors, their role in migraine and the pharmacology of CGRP pathway blocking drugs.



DR TAMSIN HILLIARD

Dr Hilliard is a Neurologist specialising in headache and facial pain disorders. Born and raised in Tasmania, she completed her neurology training at the Royal Hobart Hospital and The Alfred Hospital in Melbourne, completing the Alfred headache fellowship in 2024. In 2023 she was selected to attend the iHEAD academy in Seoul, South Korea for early career headache researchers and is currently completing a Master's by Research at Monash University, focusing on the efficacy of advanced migraine treatments for non-headache symptoms in migraine. Dr Hilliard is passionate about reducing the significant burden of migraine and other headache disorders in Tasmania through accurate diagnosis, education, and evidence-based care.







DR ELSPETH HUTTON

Dr Elspeth Hutton (PhD, FRACP, MBBS, BMedSci(Hons)) is the current President of the Australian and New Zealand Headache Society and leads the Headache Service at Alfred Health, Melbourne. Dr Hutton established the first multidisciplinary headache service in a public teaching hospital in Australia, which has supported training of 5 headache fellows and 5 higher degree completions. She is engaged with consumer and policy groups to improve access to headache care in the region.



DR JANE PROSSER

Dr Jane Prosser, MB BS PhD FRACP, is a Staff Specialist Neurologist at St George Hospital, and Director of the Stroke Service. She completed her neurology training at Royal Prince Alfred and Royal North Shore Hospitals and was awarded the ANZAN Fellowship in Neurology at the National Hospital for Neurology and Neurosurgery in London where she worked for Prof Peter Goadsby who fostered her interest in headache disorders. She completed a Stroke Research Fellowship at the University of Melbourne/Royal Melbourne Hospital where her PhD thesis examined the relationship between stroke and heart disease using MRI under the supervision of Professor Stephen Davis.





A/PROF TONY SAMMEL

A/Prof Tony Sammel is the Head of Rheumatology at Prince of Wales Hospital and has subspecialty clinical and research expertise in vasculitis. He leads the weekly rheumatology vasculitis clinic and quarterly vasculitis MDT at POWH and is a director and founding member of the Australian and New Zealand Vasculitis Society. He completed a PhD on advanced imaging and biomarkers in GCA and has lectured on GCA, systemic vasculitis and CNS limited vasculitis at Australian and international conferences.



PROFESSOR RICHARD STARK AM

Richard Stark is Adjunct Clinical Professor, Department of Neuroscience, Monash University and Neurologist at the Alfred Hospital. He is a clinical neurologist with special interest in headache including training and research. He is passionate about teaching, especially clinical skills.

Leadership roles have included: Elected Treasurer and Trustee of the World Federation of Neurology (2 terms), Past President of ANZHS, Candidate for Presidency of IHS (2025).

Awards include: E Graham Robertson Award 2009, ANZAN Medal 2012, Noshir Wadia Orator at the AOCN/IAN meeting 2022, Member of the Order of Australia (AM) 2019.
